- Kicked off a yearlong co-design process to create a U.S. Refugee Advisory Board, in partnership with <u>Refugee</u> <u>Council USA</u> and Georgetown University's <u>Institute for the Study of International Migration</u>
- Co-led the crafting and delivery of a letter from refugee leaders calling upon the Biden Administration to keep its promise to increase the Presidential Determination on refugee resettlement, which garnered more than 260 signatures and received media engagement
